Space is limited and there is a lottery drawing for available surgery spaces. Lottery tickets are distributed only from 7:00am until 7:15am. Drawing for surgery spaces follows ticket distribution. Only Pierce County residents are eligible.

- *Only 2 cats or 1 cat and 1 dog (subject to space availability) per person or address will be taken on a given day. Only 3 animals per individual or address in any 3-month period. A Washington driver's license or state issued ID is required.
- * **We DO NOT operate on a first-come first-served basis.** Arriving hours before registration does not help you get your animals into the clinic. **Arrive between 7:00am and 7:15am. No tickets distributed after 7:15am.**
- * Surgery is FREE for those individuals on public assistance: Proof of participation in SSD/SSI, Food Stamps, Major VA Disability, WIC, Section 8 Housing, TANF, Medicaid, or other state or federal public assistance programs is required.

For those not on public assistance: Cat neuters (males) \$20; Cat spays (females) \$30; Dog spays \$50; Dog neuters \$40; Microchip your pet: \$15.
- * We provide low-cost vaccinations to pets that are in the clinic for surgery. If staff are available, we will sell other pet owners low cost flea treatments and will microchip their pet for \$15. We accept CASH ONLY - NO checks or credit cards.
- * Dogs must be at least four (4) months of age. Kittens must weigh at least 3 pounds.
- * For dogs 8 years and older, we recommended that you take your senior animal to your veterinarian for blood work. Anesthesia can be tough on older animals. Our vet staff has the right to turn away your pet if they feel your animal should have blood work prior to surgery. Pregnant or in-heat are okay to bring for surgery.
- * We cannot accommodate aggressive dogs or giant breed dogs unless they are puppies.
- * Do not give your adult animal any food or water after 10 PM the night before surgery. Four-month old puppies or kittens should be fed and given water, up to half their usual amount, the morning of surgery. Dogs must be on a well-fitted collar and leash (or in a carrier). Cats must be confined in a carrier or pillowcase. **ONLY ONE CAT PER CARRIER OR PILLOWCASE PLEASE!!!**
- * Bring 2 towels per animal. They will be returned to you with your pet.
- **Animals must be picked up the same day as surgery.** The Veterinary Technician or On- Site Coordinator will assign you your animal pick-up time when you drop off your pet in the morning.
