HYPOTHERMIC AND WOUNDED DOG IN CRITICAL CONDITION

TACOMA, WA – On Nov. 21, a dog arrived at the Humane Society for Tacoma & Pierce County dehydrated, emaciated, hypothermic, wounded, and covered in dried urine.



Rory arrived dehydrated, emaciated, hypothermic, wounded, and covered in dried urine.

The 1-year-old boxer named Rory could barely stand upon arriving at the shelter. After examination from shelter staff, they discovered Rory's front leg was swollen to twice the normal size due to infected bite wounds.

The shelter's veterinary team immediately began providing fluids, wrapping him in heated blankets, and cleaning the infected wounds. Rory's condition continues to be monitored.
