

LOCAL ANIMAL SHELTER INUNDATED WITH SICK AND INJURED KITTENS

TACOMA, WA – On March 9, the Humane Society for Tacoma & Pierce County had a total of 26 sick and injured kittens come through its doors within 24 hours.

The kittens range from 1 day old to 6 months old. Many are covered with fleas and have respiratory infections with painfully inflamed and goopy eyes, runny noses, and thinning hair. While treatable, these infections can be deadly.

One kitten has a ruptured eye that will require surgery for the eye to be removed in order to prevent infection.

Over the next several days, each kitten will receive individualized medical care and monitoring from shelter staff. They will be treated with antibiotics, eye and nose drops, and food supplements to help gain strength.

March marks the start of kitten season, which is the busiest time of the year for the shelter. Shelter staff and fosters will provide lifesaving efforts for over a thousand kittens during the next several months.
