ONE DEAD AND FIVE CRITICALLY ILL PUPPIES ABANDONED IN BOX ALONG HIGHWAY IN URGENT NEED

TACOMA, WA – On Jan. 2, six puppies were found in a box by a community member along the Highway 7 in Elk Plain.

"I had to pull over and that's when I heard dogs crying on the other side of the barrier," says the community member who found the puppies. "I went to look and found a wet box full of puppies. I knew they needed help immediately."

One puppy was found deceased wrapped in a plastic bag along with five of its siblings experiencing severe vomiting and diarrhea.

The five puppies were brought to the Humane Society for Tacoma & Pierce County where they are currently being cared for. They arrived at the shelter sick and lethargic.

All five of the puppies tested positive for parvovirus, a deadly and contagious virus that affects the gastrointestinal tract.

If left untreated, parvovirus attacks the gastrointestinal system and causes a miserable, painful death.

The shelter's veterinary team is providing critical care, administering medication, fluids, and food.
