

SEVERELY INJURED DOG WITH RUPTURED EYE FOUND ABANDONED NEAR GAS STATION DUMPSTER

TACOMA, WA – On Feb. 8, a community member found a severely injured 6-year-old Shih Tzu abandoned next to a gas station dumpster near Joint Base Lewis-McChord.

The Shih Tzu, now named Cupid, was found with a ruptured right eye, which was protruding from its socket.

"At first, I thought it was a raccoon," says Justine Imadhay, the community member who found Cupid. "When I looked closer, I could see his eye was bulging and knew he needed help."

Cupid was taken to Summit Veterinary Hospital, and is currently being cared for at the Humane Society for Tacoma & Pierce County.

After examination by the shelter's veterinary team, it was discovered that Cupid suffers from severe dental disease in addition to his eye trauma.

Cupid's condition is severe, and he is in need of emergency surgery to remove his eye and stop the pain he is currently experiencing.
