## **13 CONFISCATED PIT BULLS RECEIVING CARE AT TACOMA SHELTER**

TACOMA, WA – On May 9, 13 pit bulls were confiscated from an Eatonville residence by Pierce County Animal Control.

They were brought to the Humane Society for Tacoma & Pierce County as the result of an ongoing animal cruelty investigation.

The dogs range in age from around 7 months old to 4 years old. Many of the dogs arrived at the shelter with facial scarring, covered in dirt and feces, and several are experiencing eye issues and infection.
