AN UPDATE ON THE DOGS FROM RECENT ONGOING ANIMAL CRUELTY INVESTIGATION

TACOMA, WA — At the beginning of the year, the Humane Society for Tacoma & Pierce County took in a large group of dogs as the result of an ongoing animal cruelty investigation.

In February 2020, the dogs were released into the care of the Humane Society for Tacoma & Pierce County by Pierce County Animal Control.

Today, more than nine months after the dogs arrived at the shelter, all but two have found their forever homes.

And there will be just one remaining come Friday, when the second to last dog, Cash, makes the long journey to his new home in Canada. His soon-to-be family has remained undettered by COVID-19 and border closures. Looking into ferry options, rescue transport, driving and flying, they've come up short until now. The family will begin their journey to Washington this week, picking Cash up and flying him north, then making the drive to their home.
