

PIT BULL AND HER 11 PUPPIES FOUND ABANDONED IN PUBLIC RESTROOM





TACOMA, WA – On May 5, Tacoma Animal Control received a call about a 4-year-old pit bull and 11 of her 1-week-old puppies found abandoned in a public restroom at Point Defiance Park.

They were found in the restroom stall with the mother dog tied to a suitcase that had her puppies inside.

Tacoma Animal Control brought the dogs to the Humane Society for Tacoma & Pierce County where they are currently being cared for. The mother dog arrived emaciated and starving.

Thorough veterinary exams found that some of the puppies have strangles, a condition that causes swelling in the face and skin lesions. The puppies are receiving medical treatment for the condition.

The mother dog and her puppies are currently being fostered by the good Samaritan who found them.
